Alabama Gleaning Network

Alabama Gleaning Network builds relationships with growers, packing houses, farmers markets, community gardens, and others to access surplus or unmarketable produce. The goal is for it to be as easy for a farmer to donate their excess produce as it would be to let it rot in the field or landfill. Honda's funding will be used to help glean and distribute truckloads of produce. Additionally, if crop drops (a large load between 20,000 - 30,000 pounds) are made available to AGN, it can purchase them at a discount to be bagged and distributed by volunteers in the community. Funding also will be used to pay for the logistics, transportation and packaging of smaller loads that are received from farms or distributors.

MIC is both impactful and extremely affordable, enabling schools to choose a program that meets their needs and is accessible to hundreds of students for less than \$1/student/day. Some schools are cycling more than one class through the host classroom (the one that has the mussel aquarium) to create greater economies of scale and reduce the school's program cost/student.

While serving children ages 3-16 at its 20-acre Education Center, Ohio Wildlife Center's weekly summer camps provide unique outdoor environmental education experiences. Ohio Wildlife Center's 2022 Summer Day Camp will focus on investigating and exploring its 20-acres of forests, ponds and prairies by incorporating new topics: Superhero Wildlife, Survival in the Wilderness, Nature, Wildlife Avengers and some of the recurring themes, including Art and Wizardly Wildlife.
